# **Community Recycling and Cleanups**

In the first quarter of 2014, Keep Atlanta Beautiful recycled **46,908 lbs. of electronics, 768 lbs. of Styrofoam, 1,374 gallons of latex paint, 14,500 lbs. of shredded paper, 5,652 lbs. of single-stream materials, and 4,160 lbs. of metals at our Community Recycling Centers (CRCs), and provided cleanup supplies for 521 volunteers at 17 community cleanups. ### **Bring One for the Chipper**

On January 4, volunteers from two local Boy Scout Troops and members of the KAtlB Board helped Keep Atlanta Beautiful and Davey Tree Company recycle trees for the Bring One for the Chipper annual Christmas tree recycling program. Since 1991, "Bring One for the Chipper" has collected more than 5 million trees. The mulch from these trees has been used for playgrounds, local government beautification projects, and residential yards. **Buckhead Home Depot:** Boy Scout Troop 298, chartered at Buckhead Methodist Church. **Midtown Home Depot:** Boy Scout Troop 18, chartered at Glenn Memorial United Methodist Church, next to Emory University.

#### 2014 CRC Origin Study

Summary: During February 2013 and 2014, Keep Atlanta Beautiful conducted community origin studies for the people attending the Old 4th Ward and Buckhead Community Recycling Centers. The principal finding was that both Centers continue to draw from an increasing number of neighborhoods. Consolidated Findings (both locations): In total, recyclers were drawn from 91 different neighborhoods, (some people utilize both Centers), versus 64 neighborhoods in 2013, an increase of 42%. The number of cars visiting the Centers, and being surveyed on the two days, was 606 versus 439 in 2013, an increase of 38%. Click here to read the complete study.
