

KEEP ATLANTA BEAUTIFUL 2013 third guarter report

Community Recycling and Cleanups

Year-to-date for 2013, Keep Atlanta Beautiful has recycled 132,126 lbs. of electronics, 1,688 lbs. of Styrofoam, 3,880 gallons of latex paint, and 71,100 lbs. of shredded paper at our **Community Recycling Centers (CRCs)**.

In Q3, KAtlB placed six trashcans in Councilmember Carla Smith's district. To-date, we have been involved in placing 72 trashcans in the City.

Meet Our New Recyclers

We are pleased to welcome metals and single-stream (fully commingled) recycling to our Community Recycling Centers. **Amerigo Metal Recycling** accepts all metals, such as steel, aluminum, copper, brass, stainless steel, and other high temperature alloys. For example, they accept bicycles, grills, lawn chairs, metal rods, car parts, and household appliances (any coolant evacuated), etc. A list of items prohibited materials is available on our **website**. **Republic Services Atlanta** provides single stream (fully commingled) recycling services at our two recycling locations. Accepted Recyclables: Aluminum food and beverage containers, broken down cardboard and pizza boxes, junk mail, magazines and catalogs, newspapers, and plastics (#1 – 7). Glass will not be accepted at this time. For a complete list of accepted materials, **click here**.

Our menu of recycling services includes electronics, secure onsite paper shredding, Styrofoam (#6 only), latex paint, single-stream, and metals. We will also accept batteries, courtesy of **Batteries Plus**.

As part of our Improving Public Property with Private Funds program, KAtlB has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Cultural Affairs division of the Mayor's Office to restore and provide accent lighting to selected public art sculptures around the City. At this time, work is progressing on lighting the two sculptures in Piedmont Park: The Last Meter and the Peace Monument. KAtlB Board Member Ramsay Battin and Executive Director Peggy Denby met the artist in the park to get his ideas for the lighting project.
