Neighbors Lending a Helping Hand



On Saturday, April 23, 2016, KATLB's Peggy Denby and John Wolfinger were honored to be on hand for the community arts project, "Neighbors Lending a Helping Hand." The [Beecher-Donnelly Community Association](#) unveiled the project in remembrance of neighbor **Sherilan Denise Rouse**, who sought a grant from the city of Atlanta to install public art in the neighborhood. Ms. Rouse became ill and passed away in January 2016.

The project consists of the hand tracings of children, adults and seniors in the neighborhood. Their hands are covered in mosaic tile on 5- and 8-foot totem poles at the entrance of the neighborhood.
