Community Recycling and Cleanups

In the first quarter of 2013, Keep Atlanta Beautiful recycled 55,646 lbs. of electronics, 684 lbs. of Styrofoam, 884 gallons of latex paint, and 23,800 lbs. of shredded paper at our **Community Recycling Centers (CRCs)**.

Who's using our CRCs?

In February, Origin Studies were conducted at each of our CRCs to determine which areas we are servicing with the two locations. Here's what we found:



Improving Public Property

As part of our Beautification efforts, KAtlB will be working with the Atlanta Office of Cultural Affairs to assist in restoration and

- The CRCs serve a very broad area of Atlanta and surrounding areas.
- The Old Fourth Ward (OFW) CRC draws from many more neighborhoods than does Buckhead, perhaps due to the geographic size of Buckhead and its relative newness. Additionally, the O4W location is adjacent to the Interstate and easier to access.
- People will travel significant distances to recycle the items accepted by the CRCs.
- If another CRC were to be added, it would probably be best to locate it near an expressway.
